WHO WE ARE Salvation Army Florence Booth House is a 64-bed emergency women shelter. We provide shelter and basic needs to homeless women in the City of Toronto. Florence Booth House provides three meals per day, a bed, clothing as available, all basic needs relating to hygiene and a weekly nursing clinic.

Florence Booth House provides services to any woman, cis- and transgender, over 16 years of age who are experiencing homelessness and require emergency accommodation.

We offer a range of services relating to Service Planning with Counselling, Housing, Chaplaincy, Life Skills groups, Addiction support, and Community Follow Up supports for when a client moves back into the community. Our front-line staff provide daily

programming to ensure we remain engaged with clients and to build a positive rapport while they are staying at Florence Booth House.

MISSION Florence Booth House is a shelter offering compassionate, unconditional support through a holistic approach that encourages each woman to maximize her individual potential in all areas of life; body, mind and soul.

VISION Florence Booth House strives to be a safe and encouraging place that fosters growth and empowerment to women experiencing homelessness in Toronto. We are a place where staff and clients inspire and learn from each other resulting in personal growth and healing.



FLORENCE BOOTH HOUSE RESPONSE TO COVID-19

The Covid-19 pandemic created immense difficulties for an already isolated community. With a building that has a 49-bed large dormitory style, physical distancing was impossible. As of May 15, 2020, we have temporarily relocated to a hotel program, which has also allowed us to increase our capacity to 73 residents.
